

Trump's "Make Iran Great Again" Strike Could Spark the War No One Voted For

Critics from both parties are raising alarm bells about the legality of the strikes, pointing out that Trump acted without Congressional approval, once again stretching the limits of executive power in wartime. Democrats have gone further, calling it an unconstitutional war of choice that risks American lives for political gain.
