Trilateral Agreement Advances Uzbekistan-Afghanistan-Pakistan Railway Project

Pakistan, Uzbekistan, and Afghanistan have taken a major step forward in regional cooperation by signing a Framework Agreement for a Joint Feasibility Study on the Uzbekistan-Afghanistan-Pakistan (UAP) Railway Project. This agreement, finalized in Kabul, aims to enhance economic integration and trade connectivity across Central and South Asia by developing a critical rail link.

The signing ceremony was held during Pakistan's Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar's visit to Kabul. In a statement posted on X (formerly Twitter), he underscored the importance of the Naibabad–Kharlachi rail segment, a crucial
