California Inmate Links Serial Killer to Cold Cases

A California inmate has played a pivotal role in connecting convicted serial killer Joseph Naso to additional unsolved murders, highlighting the unusual ways law enforcement can gather evidence. The story is chronicled in the upcoming Oxygen series *Death Row Confidential: Secrets of a Serial Killer*, premiering Saturday, September 13 at 9 p.m. ET/PT.

Joseph Naso, convicted of murdering four women, has long been suspected of committing additional killings. The confirmation came from an unexpected source: fellow inmate William A. Noguera, who was serving time at San Quentin State Prison. According to authorities, Naso allegedly confessed to Noguera about more than 20 unsolved murders.

Noguera documented the information carefully, compiling over 300 pages of notes. He then provided this material to former FBI investigator and cold case detective Ken Mains. The notes included details that helped law enforcement link Naso to several previously unresolved cases, offering potential closure to families affected by the crimes.

The collaboration between Noguera and law enforcement is described as unusual but significant. Working from inside the prison, Noguera conducted independent investigative efforts, cross-referencing Naso's confessions with existing unsolved cases. The resulting connections allowed authorities to expand the scope of their investigation and identify potential additional victims.

Naso's criminal history has been well documented. He was convicted in the mid-2010s for the murders of four women, all involving strangulation. The information provided by Noguera has reportedly corroborated some of these suspicions, although the exact number of additional victims remains under investigation.

This case underscores the complex dynamics of criminal justice, where unconventional sources can sometimes provide critical information. Inmates, law enforcement, and investigators working together can lead to breakthroughs in cases that have remained unsolved for decades.
