

Boxer Julio César Chávez Jr. Arrested for Visa Overstay

Julio César Chávez Jr., the well-known Mexican boxer and former middleweight world champion, was arrested by U.S. immigration authorities in Los Angeles on Wednesday. The arrest came just days after his highly publicized fight against YouTube star Jake Paul. Officials say Chávez Jr. was taken into custody for overstaying his visa and providing false information on his application for a green card.

The detention happened right outside Chávez Jr.'s home. Following the arrest, U.S. officials confirmed that he will be deported back to Mexico. This development is significant, as

Yet, Chávez Jr.'s career has been marked by ups and downs. He has struggled with drug addiction and faced multiple legal issues. Over the years, he failed drug tests, missed weight for fights, and was criticized for a lack of dedication at times. His battles outside the ring seemed to overshadow his athletic achievements, complicating his journey as a professional boxer.

Before this latest arrest, Chávez Jr. had previous run-ins with the law. In 2012, he was convicted of driving under the influence in Los Angeles and spent nearly two weeks in jail. More recently, in January 2024, he was arrested on gun charges after police found two AR-style ghost rifles in his possession. Although released on a \$50,000 bond, he was required to attend a residential drug treatment program and regularly report his progress as part of his ongoing case.

Chávez Jr.'s recent fight against Jake Paul was highly publicized, drawing attention from both boxing fans and mainstream media. The bout ended in a loss for Chávez Jr., but it was seen as a chance for him to return to the spotlight. Now, with this arrest and impending deportation, his future in the United States appears uncertain.

This latest chapter adds to the complex story of a boxer who has faced immense pressure, personal struggles, and legal challenges throughout his career. As Chávez Jr. returns to Mexico, many will be watching closely to see what comes next for the fighter once considered a rising star.
