## Tuscaloosa Teacher Arrested Over Alleged Relationship with Student

A Christian school teacher in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, has been arrested for allegedly engaging in a sexual relationship with a female student. The teacher, 35-year-old Sarah Huggins Logan of North River Christian Academy, was taken into custody following an investigation by the Tuscaloosa County Sheriff's Violent Crimes Unit. The allegations came to light after the victim's parents reportedly discovered the inappropriate relationship and alerted both the school and authorities.

Logan, who appears to be married with two children, now faces charges of a school employee engaging in a sex act with a student. Officials noted that additional charges could

be filed as the investigation progresses. Details about the student's age and the timeline of the alleged misconduct have not been disclosed to the public at this time.

## Campus Response

North River Christian Academy, a private school known for its faith-based education, expressed deep sorrow over the allegations. The school emphasized that the safety of students is its top priority and confirmed that it had notified the proper state and local authorities as soon as the situation came to light.

“It should be self-evident to say that this incident is heart-rending for all involved. This includes especially the families directly impacted,” the school stated. “We have prayed for them and encouraged our entire school family to hold them up in their personal prayers. Our first concern is for the health and welfare of our students, staff, and families.”

Administrators at the academy have also urged the public to avoid contributing to speculation or rumors surrounding the case, saying that such behavior only adds to the emotional strain on those affected.

Authorities said Logan was arrested based on evidence gathered from interviews and other sources. Investigators are now encouraging anyone with further information to come forward, fearing additional victims may be involved.

The Tuscaloosa County Sheriff's Office oversees the Violent Crimes Unit, remains tight-lipped on specific details, but affirmed that the case remains active and a priority. Law enforcement officials also stressed the seriousness of the charge, which under Alabama law criminalizes any sexual contact between school employees and students, regardless of age or consent.

This incident has sparked wider conversations within the community regarding student safety and oversight at private and religious educational institutions. While the investigation is ongoing, many parents are left demanding greater transparency and accountability from school officials.

If convicted, she could face significant legal penalties, including incarceration and mandatory registration as a sex offender. The school has not commented on her employment status or the measures to support students and families during this time.
