## Delhi Woman Arrested for Killing Father with Kitchen Pan in Shahdara

A 32-year-old woman was arrested in Shahdara, Delhi, for allegedly killing her 55-year-old father by striking him with a kitchen pan during a domestic dispute. The incident occurred at the family's residence and was reported to police after the victim was brought to Guru Teg Bahadur (GTB) Hospital, where he was declared dead on arrival.

The deceased, identified as Tek Chand Goyal, was taken to the hospital by his son Shivam. Police were alerted by hospital staff regarding Goyal's condition. According to Shivam, his sister Anu, along with their mother Bala Devi and his wife Priya, were present at the time of the incident.

Priya informed Shivam that a heated argument had broken out between Anu and Goyal in the kitchen, during which Anu allegedly attacked her father with a pan. Following this, Goyal collapsed from his injuries.

Anu, who remains unmarried and lives with her parents, is said to be intellectually challenged and undergoing treatment. Family members told police that the household often experienced arguments, and tensions had been high in recent days.

The local police have registered a case of murder and taken Anu into custody. Deputy Commissioner of Police (Shahdara) Prashant Gautam confirmed that legal proceedings are underway and the investigation is active. Authorities are also examining the mental health aspect of the accused and collecting forensic evidence to establish the exact circumstances of the incident.

Goyal's body has been sent for a post-mortem to determine the exact cause of death. Investigators continue to question family members and neighbors to gain a clearer understanding of the events leading up to the fatal assault.

Police have urged residents to seek intervention or support in cases of ongoing domestic conflicts to prevent such violent outcomes. The case remains under investigation.
