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Secluded Northumberland Cabin in Fairy Wood Hits Market for £165k

A remote off-grid cabin tucked away in a Northumberland woodland famed for its fairy tales and ghostly folklore is now up for sale at £165,000. While the home offers peace and charm in equal measure, it comes with a significant caveat for would-be buyers.

Built in 1926, the two-bedroom wooden cabin is located deep within Whittle Dene Woods, near the village of Stamfordham. It was originally constructed to house evacuees during the Second World War and remains one of just ten similarly styled dwellings in the area. Known

locally for its magical reputation, the woodland is steeped in legend, with stories of fairies said to inhabit the mossy hollows and bluebell paths.

Stanholme, as the cabin is called, can only be accessed on foot via a path through the woods. On-street parking is available on nearby St Andrews Lane, but there is no vehicle access to the property itself. This five to ten-minute walk through dense woodland is part of the property's allure, although it may not appeal to everyone.

Woodland Escape

Inside, the cabin offers simple yet characterful living. A small entrance porch opens into a cosy living room with a log burner, leading into a compact kitchen space. Two bedrooms and a modest family bathroom complete the interior layout. Despite its size, the home makes clever use of its footprint and offers a warm, rustic feel.

Outside, the cabin includes a raised deck for enjoying the woodland views, a fire pit for evenings under the stars, and a compost toilet to support its off-grid nature. There is also a tool shed offering useful storage. The property is powered and operated independently of the national grid, meaning buyers must be prepared for an alternative lifestyle focused on sustainability and self-sufficiency.

The surrounding Whittle Dene Woods are said to hold both charm and mystery. Alongside tales of fairies, locals also speak of Long Lonkin, a menacing figure from the 13th century whose spirit is said to haunt the area. These myths add to the site's character, which estate agent GFW describes as one of the most magical settings in the country.

The property is leasehold, and further details on the lease length and conditions have not yet been disclosed. As the only cabin currently available in this unique enclave, the listing will likely draw attention from those looking to escape the noise and pace of modern life.

Opportunities like this are rare in today's market, where buyers increasingly seek alternative and nature-connected lifestyles. While the walk-in access may not suit all, the combination of history, seclusion, and folklore makes Stanholme a standout listing in the North East.

For those willing to embrace the remote setting, this Northumberland hideaway offers a tranquil way of life wrapped in woodland silence, historic intrigue, and just a hint of fairy tale.
