Tour Bus Crash in Upstate New York Causes Injuries

A tour bus accident on Interstate 90 in upstate New York has led to injuries and a temporary closure of the highway. The crash occurred near Pembroke, between Rochester and Buffalo, prompting authorities to shut down all lanes and warn drivers of significant delays.

According to the New York State Police, 52 people were on board the bus at the time of the incident. Emergency personnel were immediately dispatched to the scene, and additional

ambulances and medical support were requested to assist the injured passengers.

In a post on Facebook, state officials confirmed that coordination efforts were underway to provide aid to those involved. "My team is coordinating closely with @nyspolice and local officials who are working to rescue and provide assistance to everyone involved," the statement read.

A spokesperson for the New York State Police told USA TODAY that first responders were actively attending to the situation, ensuring that victims received medical attention. Traffic authorities urged motorists to seek alternative routes while the highway remained closed.

Spectrum News 1 reported that the full extent of injuries is not yet clear, but officials continue to manage the scene and prioritize the safety and well-being of those on the bus. Drivers traveling in the area are advised to remain patient as crews work to clear the roadway.

The incident highlights ongoing concerns regarding highway safety for commercial passenger vehicles. Authorities are investigating the cause of the crash and are expected to provide updates once more information becomes available.

Residents and travelers in the region are reminded to follow official guidance and exercise caution when navigating detours around the affected stretch of Interstate 90.

No further details on the identities of those involved or the severity of the injuries have been released at this time. State officials have committed to keeping the public informed as the situation develops.
