Neglect Turns Federal Capital Area into a Cesspool

Residents of the Federal Capital Area are raising alarm over the worsening condition of their neighborhoods, blaming government inaction and poor maintenance for a surge in sanitation and infrastructure issues.

Without such steps, they warn, the situation could escalate into a full-blown public health emergency.

The Federal Capital Area deserves better. As the administrative heart of the nation, its condition should reflect the government's commitment to quality of life and civic responsibility. Instead, it stands as a stark reminder of neglect and eroding public trust.

Unless authorities act swiftly to restore basic services and heed the voices of their citizens, the area's transformation from a model capital into a neglected zone will remain a lasting symbol of failed governance.
