



Islamabad Lawmakers Back CDA Plan for Civic Upgrades

Lawmakers representing Islamabad have pledged their full support for the Capital Development Authority's (CDA) initiatives aimed at improving civic services and infrastructure across the federal capital, with a focus on both urban and rural areas.

The commitment came during a recent meeting between parliamentarians and CDA officials, where participants discussed key development priorities for the city. These included beautification projects, expansion of public transport services, and measures to ensure the provision of clean drinking water to underserved communities.

Parliamentarians assured the CDA of their continued cooperation, noting that regular updates should be shared with the public to maintain trust and demonstrate progress. They also encouraged closer engagement with local communities to ensure development projects align with the needs of residents.

The CDA reaffirmed its commitment to sustainable and inclusive growth for Islamabad, emphasising that both urban centres and peripheral rural areas stand to benefit from these initiatives. With parliamentary backing and a structured oversight plan, the authority aims to deliver tangible improvements in public services and infrastructure, enhancing the quality of life for all residents of the capital.

The joint stance of lawmakers and the CDA signals a coordinated approach to tackling Islamabad's civic and infrastructure challenges. By combining legislative support with administrative action, the city's leadership hopes to set a precedent for effective governance and long-term urban planning in Pakistan's capital.
