

New York City Protest Condemns Civilian Casualties in Gaza

New York, USA – Hundreds of demonstrators gathered in Manhattan on Saturday as part of a coordinated protest known as the Day of Action, raising concerns about the humanitarian situation in Gaza.

The protest, held in New York's central district, featured participants carrying signs and chanting slogans critical of military actions affecting civilians in the Gaza Strip. Protesters

also voiced opposition to continued U.S. support for Israel, calling for a reassessment of foreign policy regarding the conflict.

Organizers of the demonstration stated that the event was part of a broader international movement aimed at drawing attention to alleged human rights abuses and the deteriorating humanitarian conditions in the region. They emphasized the need for a peaceful resolution and an end to civilian suffering.

Speakers at the event urged the international community to respond to reports of food shortages and civilian casualties, citing concerns raised by global humanitarian organizations. However, no official government or international body has used the term genocide about the ongoing conflict.

The protest remained peaceful, with local law enforcement present to monitor the gathering. No arrests or disturbances were reported during the event.

The demonstration in New York was one of several similar protests held globally over the weekend, reflecting widespread public concern about the impact of ongoing military operations on non-combatants in Gaza.

As of now, U.S. officials have maintained support for Israel while also urging the protection of civilian lives and compliance with international humanitarian law.
