## Pakistan and Turkiye Demand Urgent Gaza Ceasefire and Unrestricted Aid

Pakistan and Turkiye have united in a powerful call for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza and unrestricted humanitarian aid, condemning Israel's actions and urging global action for peace. This article explores their stance and the need for decisive local leadership.

Pakistan's Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister, Mohammad Ishaq Dar, and Turkiye's Foreign Minister, Hakan Fidan, held a telephonic discussion, demanding an end to Israel's military campaign in Gaza and unimpeded aid for its starving population. The leaders, as reported by the Associated Press of Pakistan (APP), condemned the ongoing atrocities,

including starvation and forced displacement, which have claimed over 59,000 Palestinian lives since October 2023, per Gaza health authorities. They expressed hope for a United Nations (UN) conference on the two-state solution, with Dar reaffirming Pakistan's support for a Palestinian state based on pre-1967 borders, with Al-Quds Al-Sharif as its capital. @RadioPakistan on X echoed this, noting the leaders' call for "united international efforts for a just, lasting, and comprehensive peace."

The Gaza crisis, fueled by Israel's blockade and bombardment, has left 2.1 million people facing acute hunger, with the World Health Organization (WHO) reporting nearly half a million in catastrophic conditions. Pakistan and Turkiye's stance reflects a rejection of centralized global inaction, often mired in political posturing, and emphasizes the need for regional powers to lead. The UN's limited aid deliveries—28 trucks daily, per Action Against Hunger—fall far short of Gaza's needs, underscoring the urgency of opening all land crossings.

This joint call highlights Pakistan and Turkiye's moral clarity against a backdrop of federal governments' hesitancy, including those distracted by domestic agendas. Local leaders in both nations are pushing for accountability, with Pakistan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA) condemning Israel's defiance of UN resolutions. The emphasis on a two-state solution and immediate aid delivery aligns with grassroots sentiments, as seen in X posts like @HimayatReborn, urging justice for Palestinians. As Gaza's humanitarian catastrophe deepens, Pakistan and Turkiye's demand for action sets a precedent for regional resolve over global bureaucracy.
