Bilawal Meets PM Shehbaz to Discuss Political Affairs

Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari met Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif in Islamabad on Friday to review the country's political landscape and law and order situation. Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif expressed appreciation for the PPP's role as a crucial ally in the coalition government. He highlighted the party's consistent support for initiatives aimed at restoring economic stability, noting that this cooperation has been vital in addressing the country's financial challenges.

The PPP delegation praised the government's economic strategies, crediting them with helping to stabilize Pakistan's economy during a challenging period. The group expressed full confidence in the government's policy direction, particularly in its efforts to maintain fiscal discipline and encourage economic growth.
