

Kelly Osbourne Mourns Father Ozzy with Heartfelt Black Sabbath Lyrics

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Kelly Osbourne, the youngest daughter of legendary rocker Ozzy Osbourne, shared a deeply emotional tribute to her father following his passing on Tuesday, July 22, 2025, at the age of 76. The former Black Sabbath frontman died just weeks after the band's final performance at Villa Park in their hometown of Birmingham, England, on July 5, 2025.

In a poignant Instagram post, Kelly, 40, expressed her grief by quoting lyrics from Black Sabbath's 1972 song "Changes": "I feel unhappy. I am so sad. I lost the best friend I ever had," accompanied by a broken heart emoji. The song holds special significance for Kelly, who performed it with her father in 2003 for a single on her debut album, *Shut Up*. The post captured the raw sorrow of losing not just a father but a lifelong confidant and collaborator.

The Osbourne family confirmed Ozzy's death in a statement released earlier this week. "It is with more sadness than mere words can convey that we have to report that our beloved Ozzy Osbourne has passed away this morning," the statement read. "He was with his family and surrounded by love. We ask everyone to respect our family's privacy at this time."

Ozzy's sisters, Jean Powell and Gillian Heming, spoke to *The Mirror* about their brother's final days. "We saw him in Birmingham the other week when he and the rest of the band were given the freedom of the city," they said. "It was upsetting because he could not stand up straight, but he was still our John, still cracking the jokes." They added, "To us, he was our brother, not a celebrity, so it's crazy to see the outpouring of love since his death was announced." Their words paint a picture of a man who, despite his frailty, remained a charismatic figure loved by millions.

Black Sabbath's surviving members also paid tribute to their late frontman. The band's official Instagram account posted a simple yet powerful message: "Ozzy forever." Bassist Terence "Geezer" Butler reflected on their final show, writing, "I'm so glad we got to do it one last time." Guitarist Tony Iommi called the news "heartbreaking," noting, "There won't ever be another like him." Drummer Bill Ward shared a photo with Ozzy, writing, "Where will I find you now? In the memories, our unspoken embraces, our missed phone calls, no, you're forever in my heart." These tributes underscore the profound impact Ozzy had on his bandmates and the music world.

Ozzy Osbourne's legacy as a pioneer of heavy metal remains unmatched. His raw energy, distinctive voice, and unapologetic persona made Black Sabbath a cultural force, influencing generations of musicians. While the world mourns the loss of a rock icon, Kelly's heartfelt words remind us of the personal side of this larger-than-life figure—a father, a friend, and a brother whose presence will be deeply missed.
