Canada Looks to Break Semi-Final Curse Against Australia in U19 Women's Basketball Showdown

BRNO, Czechia, Canada enters yet another high-stakes Semi-Final at the *Fédération Internationale de Basketball* (FIBA) Under-19 (U19) Women's Basketball World Cup with history working against them.
