## Murree Meeting Addresses Counter-Terrorism and Party Reorganization: Khurram Dastgir

In Murree, Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) leaders, including Khurram Dastgir Khan, convened to strategize on counter-terrorism and party reorganization, signaling a robust response to security threats. This article explores the meeting's outcomes, PML-N's commitment to stability, and the broader implications for Pakistan's fight against extremism.

On July 26, 2025, senior PML-N figures gathered in Murree to tackle pressing national issues, with former Federal Minister Khurram Dastgir Khan emphasizing the need for a unified approach to counter-terrorism and internal party reform. The meeting, held amid

rising violence in regions like Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (K-P), focused on strengthening Pakistan's defenses against groups like the banned Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), referred to as Fitna al Khawarij by the state. Dastgir, a seasoned PML-N leader from Gujranwala, underscored the importance of reorganizing the party to enhance its grassroots presence, ensuring it remains a formidable force against both political and security challenges. "We must fortify our resolve to crush terrorism while revitalizing our ranks," Dastgir stated, as reported by The Express Tribune.

The Murree discussions come in the wake of recent attacks, including the tragic Tirah Valley assault that killed civilians, highlighting the urgency of a cohesive counter-terrorism strategy. PML-N leaders reviewed the National Action Plan (NAP), a 2014 framework established after the Peshawar school massacre to combat extremism, but critics argue it needs revitalization to address evolving threats. The party's reorganization efforts aim to bolster local leadership in K-P and Balochistan, where militant groups exploit governance gaps. Dastgir, drawing on his experience as former Defence Minister, called for enhanced intelligence coordination and community engagement to curb militancy.

Pakistan's battle against terrorism demands more than rhetoric, it requires action. The Murree meeting signals PML-N's intent to lead on both fronts, but success hinges on translating plans into results. Strengthening security forces, improving local governance, and empowering communities are critical to dismantling terrorist networks. As PML-N restructures, it must also rebuild public trust to counter opposition narratives.

The Murree gathering marks a pivotal moment for PML-N to address Pakistan's security and political challenges. Dastgir's leadership underscores the party's determination, but the nation awaits concrete steps to ensure safety and stability.
