## Sesko in Demand as Premier League Clubs Make Moves

As the Premier League prepares for the new season, clubs across England are navigating a tense final stretch of the summer transfer window. With just weeks remaining, key transfer decisions could shape the fortunes of several top-flight sides.

Newcastle United are facing increasing pressure amid growing uncertainty over the future of striker Alexander Isak. The 24-year-old Sweden international has drawn attention from

abroad and could leave for the right price. Manager Eddie Howe is reportedly keen to secure a quality replacement should Isak depart, with Red Bull Leipzig forward Benjamin Šeško emerging as a potential target.

Šeško, 21, remains one of the most sought-after young strikers in Europe. Both Newcastle United and Manchester United are believed to be monitoring his situation closely, with the Slovenian forward yet to confirm where he will be playing next season.

Meanwhile, Arsenal are continuing their recruitment efforts following a rejected approach for a key midfield target. Manager Mikel Arteta is said to be focused on adding depth across multiple positions, but has faced challenges in securing deals.

Liverpool have reportedly set a valuation for Uruguayan striker Darwin Núñez amid interest from several clubs. The Anfield side is understood to be open to offers but will not allow the forward to leave below their asking price. Chelsea, on the other hand, remains active in both buying and selling, with their squad overhaul ongoing under manager Enzo Maresca.

Tottenham Hotspur are also expected to be involved in transfer activity before the window closes, although the club is yet to finalise any major moves in August. Manager Ange Postecoglou is believed to be assessing several positions as the squad prepares for another challenging Premier League campaign.

The transfer window officially closes on 30 August, and with key players' futures still undecided, clubs are under pressure to act swiftly. As it stands, no major confirmations have been made, but negotiations are ongoing across multiple fronts.

With the season's opening fixtures fast approaching, fans and managers alike will be watching closely to see how the final days of the window unfold.
