## Pakistan, Iran Ministers Bolster Defence Ties in Islamabad

Pakistan's Defence Minister Khawaja Muhammad Asif and Iran's Brigadier General Aziz Nasirzadeh met in Islamabad to strengthen defence cooperation and address shared security challenges.

On August 2, 2025, Pakistan's Minister for Defence, Khawaja Muhammad Asif, hosted Iran's Minister of Defence and Armed Forces Support, Brigadier General Aziz Nasirzadeh, in Islamabad to advance bilateral defence ties. The meeting, held during the Iranian President's official visit, focused on deepening cooperation to tackle mutual security

concerns, including terrorism and border stability, according to Pakistan's Ministry of Defence. Both nations reaffirmed their commitment to regional peace and prosperity through enhanced defence collaboration.

The discussions covered critical areas such as counter-terrorism, border security, and joint military initiatives. Asif emphasized the importance of defence diplomacy in addressing shared threats, expressing gratitude for Iran's consistent engagement. Nasirzadeh highlighted Tehran's intent to pursue stronger ties based on mutual respect and trust, as noted in a Ministry of Defence statement. This sentiment was reinforced through official statements by both ministries.

This meeting builds on a history of defence collaboration, including joint naval exercises in the Arabian Sea and agreements to counter terrorism along their shared border. The Ministry of Defence reported that both sides explored opportunities for joint production of military hardware, signaling a strategic alignment. Nasirzadeh's remarks, shared via Iran's government media, underscored the mutual support between Islamabad and Tehran on international platforms, reinforcing their shared stance against regional threats.

The talks concluded with optimism about the future of Pakistan-Iran defence relations. Both ministers pledged to continue working closely, with plans for high-level follow-ups to sustain momentum. The Ministry of Defence highlighted that this partnership aims to bolster regional security while addressing the complex geopolitical dynamics affecting both nations. As Pakistan and Iran navigate their strategic interests, this meeting underscores a pragmatic approach to fostering stability through robust defence cooperation.
