## Police Respond to Active Shooter Incident Near Emory University in Atlanta

On August 8, 2025, Atlanta police responded to reports of an active shooter near Emory University's Atlanta campus at the Emory Point CVS, prompting the university to issue an urgent alert instructing students and staff to "RUN, HIDE, FIGHT" and shelter in place. The incident, which unfolded near the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) headquarters, has heightened concerns about public safety and the need for swift law enforcement action to protect communities.

The emergency alert was issued by Emory University's Office of Critical Event Preparedness and Response (CEPAR) at approximately 5:01 p.m., stating, "Emory Emergency: Active shooter on Emory Atlanta Campus at Emory Point CVS. RUN, HIDE, FIGHT. Avoid the area." A subsequent update instructed individuals to continue sheltering in place as police secured the scene. The Atlanta Police Department (APD) confirmed their presence near the 1700 block of Clifton Road, describing the situation as an "active crime scene" and urging the public to avoid the area, according to a statement reported by The Independent. Multiple law enforcement agencies, including APD, were observed at the scene, with Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) cameras showing blocked streets, indicating a significant response to ensure safety.

Witnesses reported hearing rapid gunfire, with Brandy Giraldo, chief operating officer of General Miur's deli near the campus, telling The Independent, "It sounded like fireworks going off, one right after the other." Staff at the deli locked their doors and took cover, reflecting the immediate fear and disruption caused by the incident. The proximity of the CVS to the CDC headquarters, less than a mile away, added to the urgency, though no information confirmed whether either location was specifically targeted, per NBC News. Representative Mike Collins of Georgia posted on X, urging students to "take cover" and expressing prayers for a swift resolution, highlighting the community's alarm.

The incident underscores ongoing concerns about gun violence and the importance of effective law enforcement strategies to address such threats. Emory's "RUN, HIDE, FIGHT" protocol, a standard response to active shooter situations, emphasizes personal safety and compliance with police directives. The heavy police presence, as reported by 11Alive, demonstrates a commitment to neutralizing the threat quickly, but the lack of immediate details about injuries or the suspect's status leaves the community awaiting answers. APD's ongoing investigation, supported by multiple agencies, aims to clarify the circumstances and prevent further harm.

As the situation develops, Emory University and local authorities continue to prioritize safety, with CEPAR's dispatcher noting to NBC News that no further information could be provided due to the active nature of the incident. The event, occurring in a bustling area near a major university and federal agency, reinforces the need for robust security measures and rapid response protocols to protect public spaces. Residents and students are encouraged to stay informed through official channels, such as Emory's website or APD updates, as investigations proceed to ensure accountability and restore calm to the affected area.
