1-Year-Old Rescued After Ghaziabad Abduction

A 1-year-old boy who was abducted in Loni, Ghaziabad, has been safely rescued by local police after a swift investigation. The incident occurred while the child was playing outside his home, prompting immediate action from authorities and concerned residents.

According to police, CCTV camera footage from the area proved crucial in identifying the suspect. The video showed a man later identified as Naved carrying the child away from the

neighborhood. Based on the visual evidence, officers were able to track the movements of the suspect and locate the boy.

The child was found safe at the residence of a woman in the vicinity. Police confirmed that the boy was unharmed and promptly reunited with his family. The exact nature of the woman's involvement in the case is under investigation, though authorities did not disclose whether she is facing charges.

The alleged abductor, Naved, remains at large. Law enforcement teams have launched a search operation to trace his whereabouts. Police have registered a First Information Report (FIR) and have appealed to the public to share any information that might aid in locating the suspect.

The incident has raised concerns among residents over child safety in the area. Authorities are urging parents and guardians to remain vigilant and to avoid leaving young children unattended in public spaces. They have also stressed the importance of community cooperation in preventing and responding to such crimes.

Senior police officials in Ghaziabad stated that the quick recovery of the boy was made possible through the combined efforts of law enforcement, surveillance technology, and public assistance. They noted that in cases involving minors, every minute is critical, and immediate action can make a decisive difference in the outcome.

The rescue operation highlights the role of CCTV surveillance in modern policing. Officers were able to follow the suspect's path and quickly narrow down potential locations where the child might be taken. This approach, combined with door-to-door inquiries, led them to the home where the boy was found.

While the child is now safe, the investigation remains active. Police are gathering additional witness statements and analyzing further CCTV footage from surrounding areas to determine whether others were involved in the abduction or if Naved acted alone.

The case has also prompted discussions among local authorities on enhancing security measures, particularly in residential areas with a high concentration of young children. Suggestions include increasing the number of surveillance cameras, improving street lighting, and organizing community watch groups to act as the first line of alert in emergencies.

Police have assured the family and community that the search for Naved will continue until he is apprehended and brought to justice. Officials emphasized that child abduction is a serious offense with severe legal consequences under Indian law, and such crimes will be met with strict action.

Anyone with information about the suspect has been urged to contact the Loni police station immediately. Authorities have assured confidentiality for those who come forward to assist in the investigation.
