IMF Grants Chad \$625 Million to Power Economic Growth Amid Oil and Refugee Strains

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has approved a \$625 million loan package for Chad as part of a broader strategy to support the country's ambitious development agenda. With an initial disbursement of \$38.5 million already released, the program aims to assist Chad in achieving an annual growth rate of 8 percent under its newly unveiled \$30 billion

investment plan. The funding arrives as Chad continues to face immense challenges from fluctuating oil revenues, a growing refugee population, and the need for humanitarian aid.

The IMF's Executive Board gave the green light for the arrangement under the Extended Credit Facility (ECF) and Extended Fund Facility (EFF), mechanisms designed to provide financial support to countries tackling structural issues and economic volatility. According to the IMF, the program will help reinforce macroeconomic stability, improve fiscal governance, and bolster the delivery of social services. Despite the nation's vulnerability to global oil shocks, the IMF commended Chad's leadership for its commitment to economic reform and long-term vision.



Chad's government has laid out a \$30 billion public investment framework aimed at transforming the economy through strategic infrastructure, education, and health spending. With support from international partners and institutions like the IMF, authorities hope to expand job opportunities, modernise key sectors, and reduce dependency on external aid. The funding will also be critical in addressing the burden of hosting over one million refugees from neighbouring conflict zones. Although oil remains the cornerstone of Chad's economy, the new development blueprint aims to diversify revenue sources and enhance resilience against future global shocks.

This latest financial lifeline from the IMF reflects growing confidence in Chad's reform trajectory, despite the daunting obstacles ahead. Chad's forward-looking approach is seen by the IMF as a rare example of fiscal discipline over sustainable governance.
