Punjab Agriculture Team Inspects Cotton Fields

Punjab's agricultural leadership took direct action this weekend as senior officials conducted field visits to monitor cotton cultivation progress. Following directives from Punjab Agriculture Secretary Iftikhar Ali Sahoo, Director Generals from the Agriculture Department toured key growing areas, engaging directly with farmers to assess challenges in cotton production.

This proactive engagement marks a positive step toward revitalizing Pakistan's cotton sector. While immediate results remain to be seen, such direct farmer-official interactions create opportunities for practical solutions. If followed by concrete policy measures, these efforts could help reverse declining cotton yields and restore Pakistan's position as a leading cotton producer. The true test will be whether these field observations translate into effective, farmer-centric policies in the coming months.
