

## India Launches 'Mission Sudarshan Chakra' to Build Indigenous Air Defense Shield

Prime Minister Modi highlighted that the initiative reflects India's rich cultural heritage, symbolizing precision, power, and strategic foresight. The name embodies the ambition of creating a defense system that mirrors the effectiveness of its mythological namesake.

Mission Sudarshan Chakra follows recent developments in India's security environment, including heightened tensions along international borders and concerns over cross-border threats to critical infrastructure. The government has emphasized the need for proactive measures to protect key sites, ensuring continuity of essential services and civilian safety in times of conflict.

Officials involved in the project stressed that domestic innovation and research will play a central role.
