## Traffic Diversions in Place Near Noida Expo Mart for Major Trade Events

Authorities in Greater Noida have announced temporary traffic diversions from August 3 to 6 around the Expo Mart Roundabout to facilitate the smooth movement of vehicles during two large-scale trade exhibitions. The measures are aimed at managing congestion as the events are expected to draw between 15,000 and 18,000 visitors each day.

The diversions, implemented by local traffic police, are designed to ensure orderly traffic flow while maintaining access for emergency services. Event organizers have urged attendees to make use of designated parking areas and to follow recommended alternative routes to avoid delays. The arrangements also prioritize the movement of essential and emergency vehicles to prevent any disruption to critical services.

According to officials, the traffic plan has been coordinated with event organizers to minimize inconvenience for both visitors and local commuters. Signage will be placed at key points to guide motorists toward alternate paths, and traffic personnel will be deployed to manage peak-hour movement effectively.

The Noida Expo Mart, a prominent venue for trade shows and exhibitions, regularly attracts large crowds, particularly during major industry events. With the influx of visitors over the four days, the diversions are expected to ease bottlenecks and maintain road safety in the surrounding area.

Residents and daily commuters in the vicinity have been advised to plan their travel accordingly, factoring in potential delays during event hours. Public transportation options will remain operational, and additional measures may be introduced if required based on real-time traffic conditions.

Authorities have emphasized that the success of the plan depends on public cooperation, urging drivers to adhere to posted instructions and exercise patience during the high-traffic period. These steps, they noted, are part of ongoing efforts to balance the needs of large-scale events with the day-to-day mobility requirements of the city.
