## Super Boost Delivers \$400k Windfall for Women

New analysis from industry super fund HESTA reveals the increased 12% superannuation guarantee will transform retirement outcomes for Australian women. The research shows female workers entering the workforce today could retire with \$712,000 in super, a staggering \$411,000 more than their counterparts who began careers in 1976. This dramatic improvement reflects decades of superannuation policy

enhancements, including the phased increase to 12% employer contributions.

HESTA's modelling accounts for real-world career patterns, including time out of the workforce for childcare and part-time employment periods. The comparison contrasts women benefiting from the full 12% rate throughout their working lives against previous generations who experienced lower contribution levels and later superannuation introduction.
