

Trump and Putin Set to Meet in Alaska for Ukraine Talks

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U.S. President Donald Trump and Russian President Vladimir Putin are scheduled to meet next Friday in Alaska to discuss the ongoing conflict in Ukraine. The meeting aims to address diplomatic efforts and explore potential avenues for de-escalation in the region.

Details about the agenda remain limited, but sources close to the discussions indicate that the talks will focus on ceasefire measures, humanitarian aid, and pathways toward a

negotiated settlement. Both leaders have expressed interest in finding a resolution to the conflict, which has resulted in significant geopolitical tensions.
