Cambodia to Nominate Trump for Nobel Peace Prize for Role in Border Dispute Mediation

Cambodia has revealed its intention to nominate former U.S. President Donald Trump for the Nobel Peace Prize, citing his role in easing recent border tensions with Thailand. The announcement follows a ceasefire agreement that brought an end to weeks of escalating conflict and military skirmishes between the two neighboring Southeast Asian nations.

Cambodian Deputy Prime Minister Sun Chanthol credited Trump with facilitating dialogue that led to the truce. Though specific details remain limited, Chanthol stated that Trump's intervention created the necessary conditions for both sides to de-escalate. "His mediation helped restore peace and protect the livelihoods of thousands," he said during a press briefing on Monday.

The conflict, which marked the most serious border fighting in over a decade, resulted in multiple casualties and displaced many residents in contested areas. Both countries have since pulled back their forces in line with the agreement, which is currently being monitored by regional observers to ensure lasting peace.

Beyond restoring stability, the ceasefire helped safeguard Cambodia's vital garment export industry from potential U.S. tariffs. With hundreds of thousands employed in the sector, officials viewed Trump's involvement as crucial to preserving economic stability during the volatile period.

Although the nomination is still in its early stages, Cambodia joins a few other nations, such as Pakistan and Israel, in publicly backing Trump for his peace-related efforts. However, the announcement does not indicate any endorsement by the Nobel Committee, which follows a strict and confidential review process.

The planned nomination underscores Cambodia's recognition of diplomatic efforts that transcend political boundaries. The focus remains on Trump's direct role in resolving the regional dispute, with no commentary on his broader political views or policies.

As of this writing, neither the Thai government nor the United Nations has issued an official response to the ceasefire or the nomination. Formal submissions for the Nobel Peace Prize are governed by the Nobel Foundation's regulations and remain confidential until officially disclosed.

Cambodia's move signals its commitment to peaceful conflict resolution and its intent to highlight diplomatic contributions that support regional security and stability.
