Rubio Praises Pakistan's Contributions to Global and Regional Stability

On July 25, 2025, United States Secretary of State Marco Rubio met with Pakistan's Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar in Washington, D.C., in a landmark meeting that underscored the evolving partnership between the two nations. This was Rubio's first in-person meeting with Dar and focused on key areas including counterterrorism, trade, and regional security. The discussions highlighted Pakistan's significant sacrifices in combating terrorism and its pivotal role in promoting peace and stability across South Asia.

The meeting, held at the US State Department, marked a significant step in improving diplomatic ties between Washington and Islamabad. Rubio lauded Pakistan's "everlasting sacrifices in the war on terror," a sentiment echoed by the Foreign Office in Islamabad. He

specifically praised Pakistan's contributions to regional security, including the facilitation of the extradition of a suspect connected to the 2021 Kabul Airport attack, a major incident that shook the region. This acknowledgment reflected a recognition of Pakistan's efforts in counterterrorism and its cooperation with the international community.

Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar emphasized Pakistan's potential as a promising investment destination, highlighting sectors such as agriculture, technology, and mineral resources. Dar expressed optimism about the ongoing trade discussions between the two countries, signaling an intention to deepen economic ties. He stressed the importance of a stable economic environment to attract foreign investment and foster mutual prosperity.

Rubio's remarks came amid Pakistan's active diplomatic engagements, including its role in mediating the May 2025 ceasefire agreement between India and Pakistan. The ceasefire, brokered with the assistance of the United States, represented a significant breakthrough in de-escalating long-standing tensions between the two nuclear-armed neighbors. Pakistan's Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif had earlier expressed gratitude towards the United States for facilitating this outcome, emphasizing the importance of sustained dialogue to maintain peace.

The discussions also touched upon Pakistan's diplomatic efforts with Iran amid growing tensions in the Middle East. Rubio appreciated Pakistan's mediation role, highlighting Islamabad's constructive approach in promoting regional stability. Both leaders agreed on the importance of continued collaboration to address shared challenges and enhance peace and security.

The meeting underscored Pakistan's growing influence in global security affairs and its strategic alignment with the United States. Both countries reaffirmed their commitment to counterterrorism cooperation and strengthening economic partnerships. The upcoming US-Pakistan Counterterrorism Dialogue, scheduled for August 2025 in Islamabad, was cited as a key platform to further deepen bilateral cooperation. As global security challenges evolve, the partnership between the US and Pakistan is poised to play a crucial role in fostering regional peace and prosperity.
