Police Seek Missing Woman in Western Sydney

Police are appealing for public assistance to locate a woman missing from Sydney's west since late July.

Lisa Alayari, also known as Lisa Johnson, aged 62, was last seen at Harris Park Train Station around 7 p.m. on Friday, 25 July 2025. Concerns for her welfare were raised after she could not be reached, prompting officers from Cumberland Police Area Command to begin inquiries on 7 August.

Ms Alayari is described as Caucasian, approximately 160cm tall, with a medium build and blonde hair. She is known to frequent the Granville, Guildford, and Mays Hill areas. There is unconfirmed information she may have been seen in the Redfern area on 6 August.

NSW Police are urging anyone who may have seen Lisa or knows of her whereabouts to contact authorities. Police are particularly interested in any sightings around the suburbs she is known to visit.

Anyone with information is asked to contact Granville Police Station or call Crime Stoppers on 1800333000. Information can also be provided online via the Crime Stoppers website. Police have advised the public not to report information through social media.

The investigation is ongoing, with officers working to establish Ms Alayari's movements in the days leading up to her disappearance.

This case is part of continued efforts by NSW Police to locate missing persons across the state. Community involvement is often crucial in resolving such cases, and police have reiterated the importance of reporting any relevant information, no matter how minor it may seem.

Authorities are concerned for Ms Alayari's wellbeing and are hopeful public assistance will help ensure her safe return.
