Cricket Star Chris Lynn Lists Luxury Brisbane Home for \$2,000 Weekly Rent

Big Bash League record-holder Chris Lynn has put his premium six-bedroom Windsor residence on the rental market for \$2,000 per week, offering cricket fans a chance to experience elite athlete living. The two-level property, purchased for \$1.7 million in 2016, features premium finishes and sits in one of Brisbane's most coveted inner-city suburbs. Lynn's decision to lease the home comes as he shifts focus to his \$2.5 million Sunshine Coast beachfront property in Bokarina, adding to his growing real estate portfolio that includes a neighboring \$1.6 million investment.

The timing coincides with Australia's dominant Test performance against the West Indies, putting the spotlight on the power-hitter's lifestyle. As the BBL's all-time leading run-scorer and current Hampshire Hawks player, Lynn's property move reflects the transient nature of professional sports careers. The Windsor home served as his primary residence with partner Karlie until their coastal relocation, demonstrating how athlete mobility creates unique opportunities in premium rental markets.

Real estate analysts note the asking price aligns with Brisbane's tightening luxury rental sector, where high-net-worth professionals and expatriates compete for turnkey properties. Lynn's investment strategy acquiring adjacent Sunshine Coast properties reveals a savvy understanding of Queensland's shifting prestige markets. His Bokarina purchases during the pandemic property boom have already shown significant appreciation, with coastal val rising 34% since 2020 according to CoreLogic data.



For aspiring tenants, Lynn's home offers more than premium accommodation; it's a tangible connection to sporting success. Yet the listing also highlights a broader trend of athletes diversifying into real estate as playing careers evolve. As Lynn continues smashing boundaries on global T20 circuits, his property portfolio quietly accumulates runs off the field. In Australia's competitive housing market, this cricket star proves championship form extends beyond the crease.
